National Curriculum

<u>As Scientists</u> we will be investigating our digestive system and including the importance of teeth! It may get messy!

<u>As Writers</u> we will be aiming to inform our audience with recounts, non-chronological reports and character descriptions, using apostrophes to show possession and improving sentences by using fronted adverbials. Largely in the context of our class book, Krindlekrax.

<u>As Mathematicians</u> we will be developing understanding of place value (including Roman numerals), addition and subtraction.

<u>As Historians</u> we be exploring life in Anglo-Saxon times.

<u>As Geographers</u> we will use maps (physical and digital) to find UK settlements with Saxon names and to help locate countries of Europe.

<u>In French</u> we will be learning to introduce ourselves.

<u>As Design Technologists</u> we will be cooking and adapting Saxon stew. We will also explore, Anglo-Saxon textiles and metalwork.

As Artists we will be revisiting Kandinsky and using Saxon designs and techniques to create clay pots.

<u>As Musicians</u> we will be learning the cornet and developing our appreciation of a wider range of music. (Mr Pritchard)

<u>In Computing</u> we will using a DTP to combine text and images, then exploring computer systems and networks, especially the Internet, whilst revising the importance of e-safety.

<u>In RE</u> we will be asking "What do Christians learn from the Creation story?"

<u>As athletes</u> we will be challenging ourselves to develop our agility, co-ordination and teamwork, specifically in the context of hockey.

<u>As dramatists</u> we will use actions, facial expression and movement to convey feelings and perform small and whole group plays, based on Beowulf.
