Here are your homework activities for this half term. Choose one item each week to complete. Bring your homework book into school every Wednesday where it will be returned to you every Friday. Remember to read four or five times a week and practise your spellings. Continue to practise your times tables **every week**. Practise reciting counting in twos, threes, fives and tens.

Design a new mini-beast. Will it have wings? How many legs will it have? What colours will it be? Will it have any special features to help it survive its environment? Draw a picture of your mini-beast and label it.

Bug Hunt—can you find some mini-beasts in your garden or when you go out for a walk? Record your findings in a tally chart. Which was the most popular mini-beast? Which was the least popular mini-beast?

Habitats and micro-habitats. Create an area in your garden that mini-beasts would enjoy. You could make a bug hotel or a bog for the bog baby to enjoy! You can think about the different conditions different bugs like to live in...damp and dark...dry and dusty.

Pretend you are a super bug and write a short story about your adventures.

Tray bake—bake something delicious to share with your family such as brownies, blondies or flapjacks. Practise your measuring skills and reading the scales. Afterwards, cut your tray bake into an array such as 3 rows and 6 columns $3 \times 6 = 18$ pieces or 4 rows and 5 columns $4 \times 5 = 20$ pieces.

Last term was short so if you have activities from the last homework sheet that you want to complete, please do so!

Time—practise telling the time., o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to. If you are feeling adventurous, practise with 5 minute increments.

Money—practise recognising the different coins and notes we use. Can you count the total in your piggy bank?
