Try to choose descriptive verbs and begin some sentences with fronted adverbials.</p>	<p>Action</p> <p>Using perspective Take a photo or video of something strange! (E.g. set up a model Lego scene with a giant cat terrorising it. Use perspective to make your sister fit on your hand.)</p>
