Add labels to name and describe.</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Research and design your own Saxon-style brooch.</p>
<p>Science</p> <p>Design a poster to encourage people to look after their teeth.</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Draw a picture of an Anglo-Saxon village labelling jobs, crafts and buildings.</p>	<p>History/Geography</p> <p>Investigate any local place names with Saxon meaning.</p>
<p>Describe</p> <p>Write a detailed description of a monster. Think about how it moves, sounds, even smells, as well as looks.</p>	<p>Every week</p> <p>Spelling – in addition to the opportunities in school, try to use Spelling Shed at least once a week.</p>	<p>Design & Technology</p> <p>Do some research and experiment with some more Anglo-Saxon cooking.</p>
<p>Maths</p> <p>Practise times tables daily (7 mins is best). Use TTRockstars, songs or games.</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Write about the Anglo-Saxon king you think was the "greatest". Don't forget to say why.</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>Research one of the countries the Anglo-Saxons came from (Germany, Denmark & The Netherlands). Compare it to the UK. How big is it? Think about land area, mountains, rivers, coastline etc.</p>
