From Linton Records

Benjamin James was born to William and Elizabeth James on 28.5.1787

His parents were married on 26.11.1765. Both were from Linton, Elizabeth's maiden name was Warr. His father died on 14.10.1799 aged 67 (born 1728?). His mother died 26 July 1811 aged 70 (born 1741). She must have been 46 when Ben was born.

Ben may have been a worker on building the new road through Gorsley — from Newent to Upton Bishop and Ross-on-Wye, completed by 1810. Some of his land may have been used for the roadway.

Two doors away - Jo Forty was living

Son John Drew born 1825 was married to Mary James And living in Gorsley. He was a sawyer employing three men. They had two children — Jane and Lydia.





420, 421,422, 430 - White House — later, Arthur Clifford's place And orchards — 498 & 507 (Darnells lane) 445 (Sugar Tump) Philip James owned

423, 424, 425, 426, 427, 429 - next to White House- The Rock 379 - opposite Aldore

Thomas James owned 747, 378 - Taylors and 428

WILL of Benjamin James who died in 1861 Bequeathed to

Hillcrest on Forty's pitch – this was the farmhouse where Benjamin and Jane James lived. He was a farmer and road surveyor. In 1851 when Jane died their daughter came to live here with her husband George Forty and their two daughters born in Abergavenny — Sarah Jane and Rachel. It was possibly here that Edwin and Ann Jones (nee James) farmed until they moved to Longhope in 1870. Edwin was the son of John Jones of Oxenhall and son-in-law of Benjamin James.

This cottage opposite Prospect Row is mentioned in Benjamin James' will. It was bequeathed to his daughter Jane Forty.



Edwin Jones' younger brother John (whose wife was Lydia, daughter of John Hall) also farmed and lived in this area. John may have been at Ivy House (formerly Woodhouse Farm) or on the land opposite — now covered by rough ground where a former house was demolished. It was marked on the tithe map of 1839. In 1850 John Jones taught for a year at Gorsley Goffs. Then he returned to farming.



This is the modernised house called the Rock.

It is next to White House . Philip and Martha James lived here. Philip (1812-1900) They had at least 7 children — George, Ann, Henry, Eliza, Peter, Ellen and William.

William married Sarah Jane Forty, daughter of George Forty.

They lived at Ford Farm, Kilcot, next to the Bunns (photographer and engineer at the Gas works, Newent)

Benjamin and Jane James were members of Gorsley Baptist in 1831. Their children also joined the church and some were lifelong members. George Forty their son-in-law was a deacon and secretary. He was followed by his nephew, another George Forty who took up similar posts, (leading to some confusion).
