

National Curriculum

As Writers, we will be reading Romans on the Rampage by Jeremy Strong and Escape from Pompeii by Christina Balit. We will use the books to inspire our diary and story writing. We'll also be learning about volcanoes and using our knowledge to write a non-chronological report.

As Historians, we will be exploring a range of aspects of life in the Roman Empire including armies, buildings, engineering, entertainment and the arts.

As Mathematicians, we will be continuing to learn about fractions as well as focusing on money, time, the properties of shape and statistics.

As Scientists, we will be working scientifically to explore the plants: what they need to live and grow, how water is transported within plants and the lifecycle of flowering plants.
