Every week Reading – try to read for at least 10 mins every day. Try to vary your choice of book or text. It's ok to listen to stories too.	Geography Research one of the countries the Anglo-Saxons came from (Germany, Denmark & The Netherlands). Compare it to the UK. How big is it? Think about land area, mountains, rivers, coastline etc.	Every Week Maths - Practise times tables daily in the Garage section of TTRockstars (an average of 7 minutes daily is thought best), in addition to practice in school. Songs and games are good too.
History Write diary entry for a voyage across the North Sea from the point of view of an Anglo-Saxon.	Science Draw or find pictures of animals with different type of teeth. Add labels to name and describe.	History/Geography Investigate any local place names with Saxon meaning.
Science Design a poster to encourage people to look after their teeth.	History Draw a picture of an Anglo-Saxon village labelling jobs, crafts and buildings.	Design & Technology Do some research and experiment with some more Anglo-Saxon cooking.
Describe Write a detailed description of a monster. Think about how it moves, sounds, even smells, as well as looks.	Every week Spelling – in addition to the opportunities in school, try to use Spelling Shed at least once a week.	Computing Discuss e-safety with an adult at home. Agree on some family rules that will keep you safe. Perhaps use the Be Internet Legend site.
Art Research and design your own Saxon-style brooch.	History Write about the Anglo-Saxon king you think was the "greatest". Don't forget to say why.
